**TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN**

This letter serves to confirm that Buyolo Business Advisory Services ("Buyolo") was awarded four contracts by the City of Cape Town's Urban Renewal Programme in 2010, 2012 and 2013.

- ◆ The work in 2010 entailed the development of a Local Economic Development (LED) strategy for Khayelitsha and Mitchell's Plain (Khayaplain). Buyolo presented an overview of the basic LED facts and trends in Khayaplain, profiled the LED drivers and players, outlined an LED vision for the two townships and identified local as well as provincial forces and support agencies relevant to Khayaplain.
- ◆ In 2012 Buyolo conducted socio-economic (LED) profiles for 18 areas of the City of Cape Town. For this, key stakeholders in the area were identified and Buyolo conducted interviews with them. They also investigated priority-development projects suitable for URP rollout funding and conducted needs assessments for each of the areas and prioritised development interventions.
- ◆ In 2013 Buyolo developed a human-settlement baseline study for Khayelitsha. For this, they investigated forces shaping Khayelitsha's population growth, looked at instruments and policies appropriate to accelerate integrated human settlement in the townships and profiled informal settlement programmes. The company also identified strategic partners who could help accelerate an integrated human-settlement programme, including the use of land parcels for such integrated and accelerated development.
- ◆ In the same year, Buyolo facilitated a Community Police Forum (CPF) strategic session for Khayelitsha. This included their roles and responsibility, the development of a vision and a mission for the CPF as well as a strategy and implementation plans.

Based on their professionalism, reliability, hard work and the quality of their work I gladly recommend them.
